Don't Forget Mary!

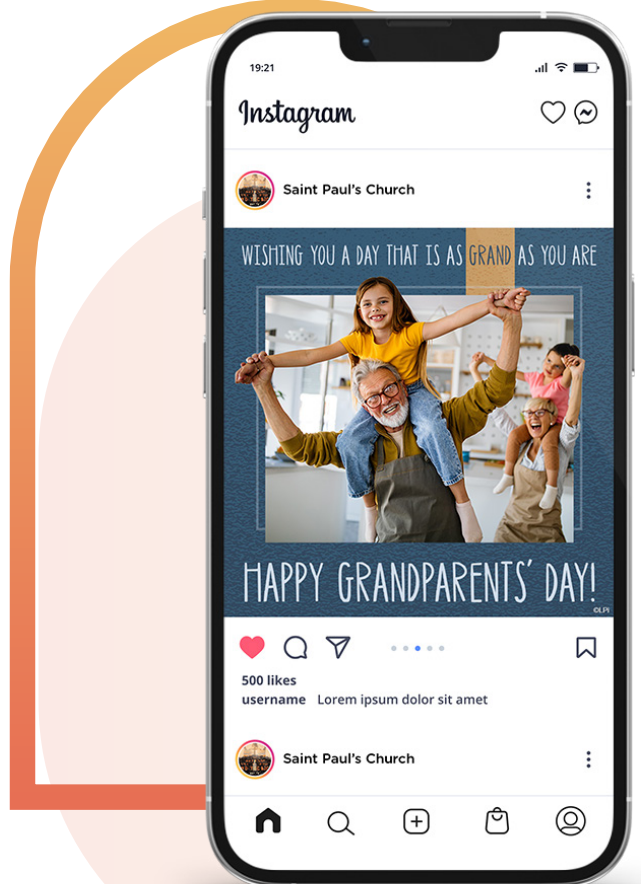

Program Orientations & Kickoffs

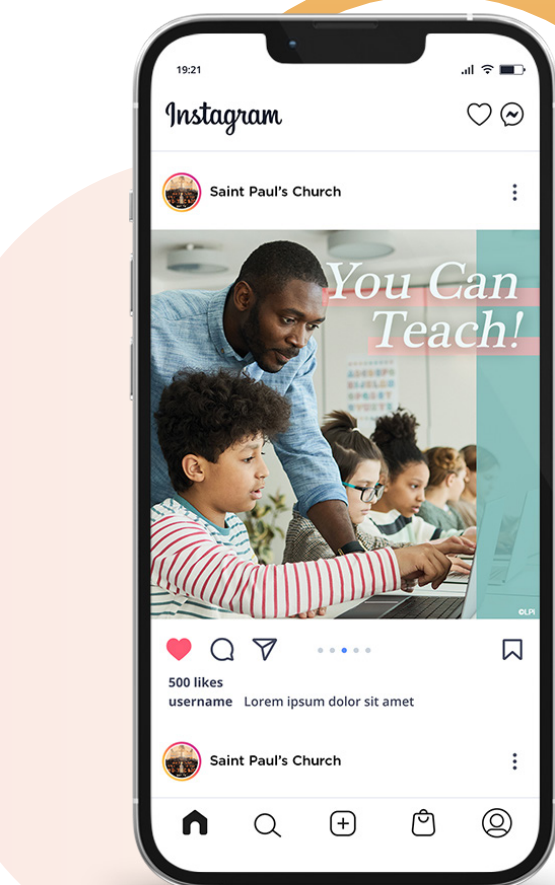
